



EXTERNAL CLEANING AND VISUAL INSPECTION OF THE FIXTURE

All users of the SGM fixtures should regularly clean those parts of the fixture directly exposed to the elements, such as the external housing and front lenses. Additionally, all owners of the SGM fixtures must periodically check the external housing of the fixture for structural breaks, deterioration, cracked lenses, or loose screws. To ensure proper operation, but also to prevent the risk of potential accidents, do not use the fixture if the lens, housing, or power cables are damaged. If parts of the fixture appear to be missing, cease use immediately and contact SGM support.



WIRING AND CONDUIT/ CONTAINMENT

SGM fixtures supplied with power and data cable leads are not intended for installation in permanently installed conduit or containment. When installing the fixtures in a permanent installation, ensure cable leads are installed as a service loop to an appropriately rated junction box using suitable cable strain reliefs/glands. All installed fixtures must be securely mounted, and service loop appropriately protected for installation location. All electrical wiring and connections should be completed by a qualified electrician.



IDENTIFICATION AND TERMINOLOGY

UNPACKING

Unpack the device and inspect it to ensure that it has not been damaged during transport.

The i-6 Series are shipped with:

- · 2 x Omega bracket with 1/4-turn fasteners (standard version)
- · Safety information leaflet
- · 2 m IP66 power cable pigtail

APPLICATION CONSIDERATIONS

The standard version is IP66-rated and is designed for both indoor and outdoor operation. It is protected from:

- · Dust, to the degree that dust cannot enter the fixture in sufficient quantities as to interfere with its operation.
- · High pressure water jets of water from any direction.

When using standard fixtures outdoors or in wet locations, ensure that:

- The DMX connection out of the last fixture in a chain is properly sealed, in accordance with the ingress protection (IP) requirements.
- The DMX out of the last fixture is terminated with a 120 Ohm resistor between pin 2 and 3 (as per RS485 standards).

When selecting a location for the device, ensure that:

- · It is situated away from public thoroughfares and protected from contact with people.
- · It has adequate ventilation.
- · It is not immersed or submerged in water.

TRANSPORT HANDLING

Always use the supplied packaging or suitable flight case for transportation and storage. Never carry the fixture by connected cables or wires.

RIGGING




Figure 1: Locking points

The i-6 may be installed in any orientation, on the ceiling or on a wall surface.

When installed horizontally with a downward beam-angle, water or dirt can potentially pool in the fan wells. Under normal operation the moisture will evaporate.

In locations with high rainfall, consider locating the fixture under cover or an overhang, or modify the position and orientation of the fixture to minimize pooling.

All SGM fixtures have locking points in the base for installation and rigging. In both standard and POI fixtures, the distance between the points from center to center is always 106 mm. Standard versions include 1/4 turn fasteners to mount SGM omega brackets. POI versions come with M-10 captive nuts for M-10 screws.

Always use the supplied omega bracket to rig a standard i-6. Lock the bracket with the 1/4-turn fasteners.

PLEASE NOTE! 1/4-TURN FASTENERS ARE ONLY LOCKED WHEN TURNED FULLY CLOCKWISE. DEPENDING ON THE STRUCTURE, PLEASE USE APPROPRIATE AND SECURE METHODS FOR MOUNTING THE OMEGA BRACKETS.




Figure 2: Dimensions for i-6 base locking points

RIGGING PROCESS USING SGM OMEGA BRACKETS




Figure 3.1: Installing the i-6

WARNING! ALWAYS USE MIN. 2 OMEGA BRACKETS WHEN RIGGING THE FIXTURE.

Start the standard rigging process by blocking the lower working area, and make sure the work is performed from a stable platform.

- 1. Check that the clamp/bracket is undamaged. Supporting structure should be capable of bearing at least 10 times the weight of all installed fixtures, lamps, cables etc.
- 2. Bolt a clamp or bracket securely to the omega bracket with a M12 bolt (min. grade 8.8) and a lock nut. For longer term installations, choose outdoor rated hardware.
- 3. Align the omega bracket with the i-6 Series base. For standard Omega Bracket, insert the fasteners into the i-6 Series base bracket, and turn both levers a full 1/4 turn clockwise to lock. When using the POI Omega Bracket, insert the included M-10 screws through the bracket holes and tighten them with a M-10 key until they are Product Version 1.0 | Revision C | Released 2023-08-28

fully attached to the base.

- 4. Hang the fixture on a truss or other structure. Tighten the clamp/bracket.
- 5. Verify that there are no combustible materials, cables, or surfaces to be illuminated within 0.3 m (12 in.) of the fixture.
- 6. Check that there is no risk of the head/yoke colliding with other fixtures or structures.



WARNING! ALWAYS SECURE AN ELEVATED FIXTURE WITH A SAFETY WIRE.

ALWAYS USE A SAFETY WIRE OF A GRADE AISI 316 STEEL.MAKE SURE THE

SLACK OF THE SAFETY WIRE IS AT A MINIMUM.NEVER USE THE YOKE/HANDLE

Fasten a safety wire (not shown) between the load-bearing support structure and the safety wire attachment point on the device.

- · The safety cable (not included in the package) must:
- · Bear at least 10 times the weight of the device (SWL).
- · Have a minimum gauge of 4 mm.
- · Have a maximum length (free fall) = 30 cm (12 in.).

TILT LOCK




Figure 5: i-6 Standard tilt lock

The fixture head can pivot through 209°.

To adjust the tilt angle in standard versions:

- Loosen the two tilt wing-screws (one on each side) by turning them counter-clockwise.
- · Tilt the fixture to the angle desired and hold it.
- Lock the position by re-tightening both tilt lock screws clockwise.

CAUTION!

ALWAYS LEAVE A FIXTURE TO COOL OFF FOR 15 MIN-UTES AFTER OPERATION BEFORE HANDLING.

POWER REQUIREMENTS

The i-6 can operate on any 100–277 V, 50/60 Hz AC mains power supply, and draws a maximum of 250W.

Connect the fixture to AC power by installing a power connector to the bare end side of the supplied power cable. Connect the powercon twist-lock connector side to the fixture. The fixture must be grounded/earthed and be able to be isolated from AC power. The AC power supply must incorporate a fuse or circuit breaker for fault protection.

The power cable color coding is given in figure 6:

- · Connect the black wire to live
- · Connect the white wire to neutral
- Connect the green/yellow wire to ground (earth)

For a temporary outdoor installation the mains cable must be fitted with a grounded connector intended for exterior

For permanent installations, a qualified electrician must wire the mains cable directly to a suitable branch circuit and as per local code. The junction's ingress protection (IP) rating must be suitable for the location. Always use a junction box with a proper IP class suitable for the environment.

After connecting the i-6 to power, run the on-board test by selecting the option "TEST→ SELFTEST" in the menu, to ensure that the fixture and each LED are functioning correctly. (POI versions are tested through RDM.)

PLEASE NOTE!

THE PROTECTIVE CAPS MUST BE SECURELY MOUNTED ON ANY UNUSED CONNECTORS, IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN THE INGRESS PROTECTION (IP RATING).

CAUTION!

DO NOT CONNECT THE FIXTURE TO AN ELECTRICAL DIMMER SYSTEM, AS DOING SO MAY CAUSE DAMAGE

CONNECTING DATA

The i-6 is controllable using a DMX control device, and it can be connected using either a DMX cable, or via the fix-ture's built-in CRMX wireless receiver system.

When using a cabled DMX system, connect the DMX-In cable to the input connector and DMX-Out cable to the output, both on the rear of the fixture's base (chassis mounted male and female 5-pin XLR plugs). For outdoor installations, use only IP-rated XLR connectors suitable for outdoor use. Terminate the DMX out cable of the last fixture in the data link with a 120 ohm DMX termination.

Note that SGM fixtures provide a passive DMX Thru signal as DMX Out, instead of an active output signal.

PLEASE NOTE! FOR POI VERSIONS, PLEASE REFER TO "PERMANENTLY CONNECTING POWER & DATA"

CONNECTING A WIRELESS TRANSMITTER

The i-6 is designed to look for wireless transmitters in 'connect' state when this option is not yet enabled. The fixture comes tested for wireless functionality from the factory, therefore the beginning of the pairing process is disconnect from the factory wireless DMX transceiver.

To connect the i-6 to a wireless transmitter:

- 1. Log off the currently paired wireless transmitter. Go to SETTINGS → WIRELESS DMX → LOG OFF in the menu. Fixture confirms logged off.
- 2. Press the connect button on the wireless transmitter.
- 3. Confirm that the fixture has paired with the wireless transmitter.

PLEASE NOTE! FOR POI VERSIONS, REFER TO "WIRELESS DATA CONNECTION" ON PAGE 16.

SIGNAL PRIORITY


The i-6 can be paired to an active wireless transmitter simultaneously when connected to a cabled DMX. The fixture will prioritize cabled DMX over wireless DMX.

The active input type is displayed under the wireless signal strength indicator. The signal strength can be also checked via RDM data by using an external RDM device.

PLEASE NOTE! IN POI VERSION WITH WIRELESS, THE DMX SIGNAL STRENGTH IS CHECKED THROUGH RDM.

The i-6 Series are shipped with:

- · 1x Spanner with magnet (POI version).
- 6 x M-10 screws (POI version).
- · Safety information leaflet

APPLICATION CONSIDERATIONS

The POI version is IP66-rated and designed for use in outdoor installations. It is protected from:

- · Dust, to the degree that dust cannot enter the device in sufficient quantities as to interfere with its operation.
- · High pressure water jets of water from any direction.

Connect to AC power using the supplied 8mm cable (the larger of the two permanently wired cables). The fixture must be grounded/earthed. The AC power supply must incorporate a fuse or circuit breaker for fault protection. For temporary programming, a plug or terminals can be used.

The power cable color coding is shown to the left:

- · Connect the black wire to live
- Connect the white wire to neutral
- · Connect the green/yellow wire to ground (earth)

The i-6 is compatible with DMX512 (ANSI E1.11 – 2008) only. It can be connected using either the SGM POI up-loader cable, or via the fixture's built-in CRMX wireless receiver system.

STEP 1: Download and install the SGM RDM Addressing tool.

STEP 2: Connect the bare end data cable to the POI Up-loader cable for POI fixtures.

STEP 3: Connect the USB up-loader cable for POI fixtures to a computer with a USB Type-A port.

STEP 4: Launch SGM RDM Addressing Tool. Click Full Discovery and look for the green light to illuminate on the fixture. Configure all settings as needed.

Step 5 Disconnect up-loader cable from computer, then disconnect up-loader cable from fixture.

Repeat Steps 2-5 for more fixtures. Multiple fixtures can be addressed and configured. Contact your SGM representative for more information on multiple fixture addressing.

SETTINGS AND FIXTURE DEFAULTS

All configuration of POI fixtures is done through the SGM Addressing Tool. The SGM Addressing Tool is a windows based program designed to allow the user to configure the fixture through the RDM protocol. All settings on a standard fixture are available on a POI fixture. But on POI, these settings are changed through the Addressing Tool.

STEP 1: Launch SGM RDM Addressing Tool. Click Full Discovery and look for the green light to illuminate on the fixture. If the green light does not appear, cycle power or refer to troubleshooting.

STEP 2: Select the standard settings tab and enter a DMX address and a personality/mode of operation. These modes must match the control mode in the controller which will control the fixture. Look for the LED indicator to blink to confirm setting change. DMX modes for POI and Std versions are identical. Refer to CONFIGURING THE DEVICE later in this manual for specifics for more information on fixture functions. Visit www.sgmlight.com to see all DMX charts available under the respective product, or upon request via support@sgmlight.com.

STEP 3: If necessary for the application, click advanced settings to set the fan mode, dimming curve, calibration or to reset to factory defaults.

STEP 4: Disconnect POI Uploader cable.

Repeat as required for multiple fixtures.

Factory Defaults are as follows:

- DMX address = 1
- · Dimming curve = Gamma Corrected
- DMX mode/personality = Default mode (6 channel CTC)
- · Startup mode = DMX
- · Screen saver = Off
- · Flip screen = Off

- · Fan mode = Standard
- · Led frequency = Dimming optimized
- · Master slave = Disabled
- · White calibrated = On
- · RDM device label set to = Fixture type name
- · Internal programs = Cleared

PLEASE NOTE! REMOTE DEVICE MANAGEMENT (RDM) REQUIRES A CORRECTLY INSTALLED AND TERMINATED DMX CABLE.

When setting addresses through RDM and using USB dongles, it may be necessary to disable "USB selective suspend" to ensure a proper voltage to the DMX link. If any lag or trouble occurs when addressing, decrease the cable length range to <12 m. and only address one fixture at a time.

WIRELESS DATA CONNECTION




Figure 10: POI Spanner

In POI fixtures with wireless, it is necessary to pair the fixture with a new transmitter (by default, the fixture is linked to the SGM factory transmitter during the testing and QA process).

In order to do so, make sure the fixture is powered on before taking the following steps:

STEP 1: Using a SGM magnetic spanner tool, place the magnet close to the LED indicator, and wait for 3 seconds. The LED indicator will blink orange for 1-2 seconds, before switching to static green again. The fixture can now be paired to a new transmitter.

STEP 2: Select "connect" or "link" on a wireless DMX transmitter. The transmitter and the internal SGM receiver should now be linked together.

Repeat the process to link the fixture to another transmitter.

To disconnect the fixture from the currently paired wireless transmitter, hold the magnet for 3 seconds over the LED indicator. The LED indicator will blink orange for 1-2 seconds, switching later to green again. The fixture is now logged off.

LED INDICATOR BEHAVIOUR

The fixture displays the status of connections, setting and errors through the LED indicator. It can have different colors and three possible stages: static, flashing, or off.

- · Solid Orange: Fixture is starting up.
- · Blinking Orange Green: Fixture is resetting its functions.
- · Blinking Green: Reset has completed, no errors and no wireless or wired DMX connection.
- · Solid Green: Wireless and / or wired DMX connected.
- · Blinking Green Orange Red: Fixture is resetting and error(s) has occurred during reset.
- · Blinking Green Red: Reset has completed but error(s) occurred during reset.
- Solid Red (3 seconds): Hall sensor is activated. When activated for longer than 3 seconds, wireless DMX connection is logged off.
- Off: fixture is off or LED indicator is set to auto-dimming (set via RDM).

Once configuration is complete, temporary power and data can be disconnected.

MOUNTING

All SGM POI fixtures have M10 size attachment points to mount the supplied brackets or directly to a structure.

The POI wash fixture may be installed in any orientation and it might take up to two brackets per fixture. Depending on the structure, please use appropriate and secure methods for mounting the Omega brackets.




Figure 12: I-6 POI base with dimensions







PLEASE NOTE! THE UNIVERSAL BRACKET HAS DIFFERENT SLOT CURVES FOR 6/8 SERIES FIXTURES AND 10 SERIES FIXTURES. WHEN ATTACHING THE BRACKET TO THE I-6, MAKE SURE THE SLOT WITH "6/8 SERIES" LABEL IS FACING AWAY FROM THE CENTER OF THE FIXTURE. BOLTS TO MOUNTING SURFACE WILL USE THIS SLOT.

WALL BRACKET ATTACHMENT


Medium 6/8 Series




Attach and align the bracket to a surface. The shorter side of the bracket is the side that attaches to a wall surface. There are two slots provided to align the bracket. Using appropriate fasteners, align and level the bracket. Then tighten to the surface.

Using the holes shown, use appropriately rated fasteners for both location and surface material and construction. Fasteners should be no larger than M6.

Use the supplied countersunk M10 bolts to secure the fixture to the bracket. Ensure cabling is not pinched or trapped when mounting fixture.

PLEASE NOTE! REMOVE RUBBER FEET FROM FIXTURE IF SO EQUIPPED PRIOR TO MOUNTING.

POI TILT LOCK





Figure 13: i-6 POI Tilt lock

The fixture can be tilted in any orientation. To adjust the tilt angle in POI fixtures:

- Loosen the two tilt lock knobs (one on each side) by turning them counter-clockwise using the small pig-nose key. Tilt the fixture to the angle desired and hold it.
- Lock the position by tightening the tilt lock knobs clockwise with the same pig-nose key.



The i-6 POI includes a spanner with a magnet, which function is to establish connection between the fixture and the wireless transmitter.


The spanner also has two types of pig-nose keys used for tilt adjustment in POI fixtures. Depending on the type of fixture, either use the large or the small pig-nose keys.




Figure 15: Connecting DMX and AC Power in POI

The last fixture in line must have a resistor installed between the yellow and black data out wires. This is to terminate the DMX signal, according to the RS-485 signal protocol.

DMX in and DMX out are in the same cable. See more in figure above about the SGM POI DMX cable.

For permanent installations, have a qualified electrician wire the mains cable directly to a suitable branch circuit. For a temporary installation, the mains cable may be fitted with a grounded connector intended for exterior use.

PLEASE NOTE!

- · Cat5e compliant cable is suitable for the transmission of DMX 512 with RDM.
- Up to 32 fixtures can be on the same DMX link. Additional fixtures will overload the link.
- The last fixture must always be fitted with a DMX termination plug to the fixtures DMX out.
- · SGM fixtures provide a passive DMX Thru signal as DMX Out, instead of an active output signal.

WIRELESS

In POI versions with wireless, it is necessary to pair the fixture with a new transmitter (by default, the fixture is linked to the SGM factory transmitter during the testing and QA process).

In order to do so, make sure the fixture is powered on before taking the following steps:

- STEP 1: Using a SGM magnetic spanner tool, place the magnet close to the LED indicator, and wait for 3 seconds. The LED indicator will blink orange for 1-2 seconds, before switching to static green again. The fixture can now be paired to a new transmitter.
- STEP 2: Select "connect" or "link" on a wireless DMX transmitter. The transmitter and the internal SGM receiver should now be linked together.

Repeat the process to link the fixture to another transmitter.

USER INTERFACE

The i-6 Series can be set up by using the control panel and OLED multi-line display on fixture's head or through RDM.

PLEASE NOTE! IN POI VERSIONS THE DISPLAY IS REPLACED BY AN INDICATOR LIGHT. THE ADJUSTMENTS ARE MADE THROUGH RDM. SEE "POI PERMANENT OUTDOOR INSTALLATION" FOR MORE INFORMATION.

The OLED display shows the current status and menu of the fixture. It is used to configure individual fixture settings and read error messages. The complete list of the menu and all commands available are listed in "Control menu".

Before turning on the i-6, make sure the power cable is properly connected. When the fixture is powered on it will boot and reset before displaying the selected operating mode and DMX start address. Navigate through the menus and options using the arrow buttons, and select items using the ENTER button.

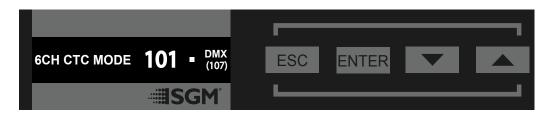


Figure 16: OLED display and control panel

USING THE DISPLAY PANEL

- Press the 'ENTER' button to access the menu or make a selection.
- Press the arrow buttons to scroll up and down in the menus.
- Press the 'ESC' button to take a step back in the menu.

SHORTCUTS

- ESC + ENTER: Press ENTER to confirm factory defaults.
- · ESC + UP: Press ENTER to start LED test.
- UP + DOWN arrows simultaneously = flip the display upside-down.

OPERATIONAL MODE (A)


Displays the current mode (quick color, stand-alone, or DMX mode). The fixture is set by default to be controlled in DMX mode.

DMX ADDRESS (B)

Displays the current DMX address. The DMX address is altered directly from this view.

EXTERNAL DATA INDICATOR (C)

The DMX signal indicator will flash when the DMX signal is received.

EXTERNAL DATA PROTOCOL (D)

Shows the external data protocol (CRMX™ or DMX).

- · When 'DMX' is displayed: the fixture responds to data received through cabled DMX.
- · When 'CRMX' is displayed: the fixture responds to data received through wireless DMX.

The next available DMX address will show immediately, depending on the fixture's DMX footprint.

ERROR INDICATOR

If any errors are detected, the message 'ERR' will be flashing in the display for easy detection.

To read the error message, select ENTER → INFO → ERRORS in the menu.

CONFIGURING THE DEVICE FOR DMX CONTROL

ABOUT DMX

The i-6 can be controlled using signals sent by a DMX controller on a number of DMX channels.

DMX is the USITT DMX512-A standard, based on the RS-485 standard. The signal is sent as DMX data from a console (or a controller) to the fixtures via a shielded twisted pair cable designed for RS-485 devices.

The cables can be daisy chained between the fixtures, and up to 32 fixtures can be connected on the same DMX link. Up to 300 m. (~1000ft.) of cable is achievable with high quality DMX cables. All DMX links must be terminated by connecting a DMX termination plug to the last fixture s 5 pin DMX out connector.

PLEASE NOTE! STANDARD MICROPHONE CABLE IS NOT SUITABLE FOR TRANSMITTING DMX.UP TO 32 FIXTURES CAN BE LINKED TO THE SAME DMX CHAIN. ADDITIONAL FIXTURES WILL OVERLOAD THE LINK.

DMX START ADDRESS

The i-6 can be operated in different DMX modes. For any of the modes, the first channel used to receive data from a DMX control device is known as the DMX start address.

For independent control, each i-6 must be assigned its own DMX start address. For example, if the first i-6 RGBW is set to 6ch CTC DMX mode with a start DMX address of 101, the following i-6 RGBW in the DMX chain should then be set to a DMX address of 107. As the first fixture uses all the first 6 DMX channels, including channel 101, the next available channel is 107 (101+6=107 >> 107).

If two or more i-6s have the same DMX start address, they will behave identically. Incorrect settings will result in unpredictable responses from the lighting controller. Address sharing can be useful for diagnostic purposes and symmetrical control.

SET/EDIT DMX ADDRESS




Figure 18: i-6 Display

The DMX address is shown on the OLED display in the control panel. To change the address setting, press the up and down arrows. When the desired address is displayed, press ENTER to save the setting. For your convenience, the next available DMX address is displayed to the right. Note that channel spacing is determined by the number of channels of the DMX mode.

See "User Interface" on page 24 for instructions on using the display panel.

The i-6 Series also offers the option to set the DMX address through RDM.

PLEASE NOTE! POI VERSIONS ARE ADDRESSABLE VIA RDM. SEE "POI PERMANENT OUTDOOR INSTALLATION".

SETTING THE DMX MODE

When selecting ENTER → MODE → Select mode in the control panel, it is possible to chose the DMX mode that provides the required controls. Confirm the chosen mode by pressing 'Enter'.

DMX CHARTS

The i-6 Series operates in different DMX modes. Each DMX mode has its own DMX chart. All DMX charts are available for download at www.sgmlight.com under the respective product, or upon request via support@sgmlight.com

SETTING A STATIC COLOR MANUALLY

The i-6 standard can be configured to display a predefined and static color.

To set up a static color select ENTER → MANUAL → QUICK COLOR.


Note that, once the MANUAL → QUICK COLOR settings are changed, the fixture will be set, by default, to automatically start in quick color mode whenever it is powered on. This can be reset through the menu SETTINGS → STARTUP MODE → SELECT STARTUP MODE.

The current quick color program can always be stopped by going to:

ENTER → MANUAL → STOP PROGRAM

USING STANDALONE OPERATION



Standalone operation is not running when the fixture is connected to a control device, but when it is pre-programmed with a series of up to 24 scenes, playing continuously in a loop. Up to three stand-alone programs can be defined and run from the menus, and one of the programs can be set to run by default whenever the fixture is powered on.

Each of the three available standalone programs contains 24 user-definable scenes with its own RGB and shutter settings.

Each scene has a definable fade-in time for the transition from one color to the next, and a wait (static) time of up to 120 minutes and 59 seconds.

To define a stand-alone program, press ENTER \rightarrow MANUAL \rightarrow EDITOR.

The standalone mode of the fixture's startup is enabled by selecting:

 $\mathsf{ENTER} o \mathsf{SETTINGS} o \mathsf{STARTUP} \ \mathsf{MODE} o \mathsf{SELECT} \ \mathsf{STARTUP} \ \mathsf{MODE} o \mathsf{STANDALONE}.$

To select the fixture's startup program, press:

 $\mathsf{ENTER} \to \mathsf{SETTINGS} \to \mathsf{STARTUP} \; \mathsf{MODE} \to \mathsf{STARTUP} \; \mathsf{PROGRAM}.$

The chosen program will run its length cyclically whenever the fixture is powered on.

To run an internal program, go to:

ENTER → MANUAL → RUN PROGRAM.

To stop an active internal program, go to:

ENTER → MANUAL → STOP PROGRAM.

FIXTURE PROPERTIES

FACTORY DEFAULT

When restoring the i-6 to the factory defaults, the following settings will be set:

- DMX address = 1
- · DMX mode = Default mode (6 channel)
- · Startup mode = DMX

- · Display saver = Off
- Flip screen = Off
- · RDM device label set to = Fixture type name
- · Internal program reset

LED ENGINE

The i-6 features 24 high-power LEDs, and is available in RGBW or in single color temperature White. The i-6 RGBW version can be operated in RGB calibrated mode which ensures that colors are compatible across the range of SGM fixtures. The i-6 RGBW also offers the ability to operate in RAW mode with full control of each color.

Color temperature correction (RGBW version only)

The i-6 offers seamless CTC (color temperature correction) control from 2000° Kelvin - 10000° Kelvin.

Ultra high-speed strobe effect

The ultra high-speed strobe effect generates random strobe and pulse effects with variable speed.

Beam angle

The i-6 has two available beam spreads, 2.3° or 3.4°.

INDIVIDUAL FIXTURE SETTINGS

Setting the dimming curve

Setting the dimming curve will determine the fixture's behaviour, when changing the light intensity between 0% - 100%

Linear control provides uniform adjustment throughout the control action, whereas gamma corrected dimming provides finer control at low light levels, where the eye is more sensitive to change. By default, the i-6 uses gamma corrected dimming. For a uniform response, set all fixtures to the same dimming curve.

Flipping the OLED display

If the fixture is installed hanging upside down, it is useful to flip the display so that it is easier to read.

To flip the display, press ENTER and select SETTINGS → FLIP DISPLAY, or press the up and down buttons on the control panel at the same time.

Setting the OLED display saver (POI n.a.)

By default the OLED display dims down after a short period when the control panel is not in use. The display can also be set to turn off completely, ideal when a pitch-black environment is required. Pressing any key will always turn on the display or restore it to normal brightness.

To configure the display settings, press ENTER \rightarrow SETTINGS \rightarrow DISPLAY SAVER.

NOTE: To avoid the risk of display deterioration caused by long term usage, it is recommended to select the setting → DISPLAY OFF.

Setting the fan mode

For operating environments where low-noise is a requirement, or where the fixture will be operating in high temperatures, it is possible to adjust the default fan speed by going to SETTINGS \rightarrow FAN MODE in the menu.

PLEASE NOTE! IN POI FIXTURES, FAN MODE ADJUSTMENT IS DONE THROUGH RDM

Setting LED refresh rate (Frequency)

When using LED lighting with cameras, flickering can occur due to incompatible frequency settings which means the LEDs and cameras are not synchronized. In order to avoid flickering and horizontal banding (rolling shutter) the i-6 offers the ability to adjust the refresh rate (frequency) in order to achieve flicker-free performance.

In the i-6 menu, go to SETTINGS \rightarrow REFRESH RATE. Here you are able to set the refresh rate (frequency) of the LEDs to be:

- · Dimmer optimized (low frequency), flicker can occur on cameras / highest dimming resolution.
- · High frequency optimized (low dimming resolution), flicker is unlikely to occur / low dimming resolution.
- · Custom value, from 3.294Hz to 30kHz. Adjust to a custom frequency.

It is recommended to utilize "Dimmer optimized" whenever possible to maintain the best possible dimming performance. When adjusting a custom value, choose a frequency high enough to avoid flickering and/or horizontal banding, but low enough to maintain a good dimming performance. Since there are differences between camera models, exposure settings etc., the optimal refresh rate settings will differ.

Using the anti glare shields will remove any unwanted glare and reflections.

The anti glare shields are easily mounted by removing the two tilt lock bolts, one in each side of the fixture. Refit the anti glare shield in position and screw both tilt locks bolts again.




Figure 24.2: SGM Firmware tool




Figure 24.3: SGM Addressing Tool

FIRMWARE UPDATES

Fixture firmware can be identified in two different ways:

Standard Fixture

- When powering on a standard fixture, the display shows the current installed firmware version.
- · Go to MENU → INFO → FIRMWARE VERSION (on standard).
- · Through RDM

POI Fixture

- Connect either Std or POI uploader cable depending on which is more suitable for the installation
- · Launch the SGM RDM Adressing Tool
- Click "Full Discovery" fixture should show in the chart. Firmware will be displayed in the firmware column

To update a fixture with the latest firmware, use an SGM USB 5-Pin-XLR uploader cable, and a Windows-based computer with the SGM Firmware Tool software installed (available for download at www.sgmlight.com).

- Download the SGM Firmware Tool software from the SGM website
- Download latest firmware file from product web page on the SGM website
- Connect either Std or POI uploader cable depending on which is more suitable for the installation
- · Launch SGM Firmware Tool on a windows PC
- Click "File" then "Open" and navigate to the firmware file needed, select it and click "Open"
- The firmware is now loaded in the uploader, click "Upload Firmware"

The fixture will now update and reboot

The Firmware Tool software offers a simple DMX controller featuring 512 DMX channels for test purposes.

CLEANING

SGM fixtures with IP65 or IP66-rating do not need any cleaning procedures inside the fixture. However, cleaning the front lens may be needed to achieve the maximum light output after exposure to dust, sand, or dirt. The exterior housing can also be cleaned to get a better look. To maintain adequate cooling, fans must be cleaned periodically.

Whenever necessary, clean the fixture using a soft cloth dampened with a solution of water and a mild detergent. Do not use products that contain solvents, abrasives, or caustic agents for cleaning, as they can cause damage to hardware, cables, and connectors.

The level of cleaning required will vary greatly depending on the operating environment and installation. Therefore, it is recommended to do frequent check-ups the first few weeks of operation to see how often cleaning is necessary.
